Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year	Membership GUSC ended the Charity year with 94 adult members (16+) and 102 junior members.
	Participation in Competitions Glenurquhart fielded teams in all levels of competitions for Adults, Juniors , Male and Female and completed all games for which we were eligible. The men's first team experienged a challenging season in Shinty's Premiership and the majority of results went against them although mostly by narrow margins . As a consequence relegation back to the National Division is now inevitable but the improving performances of the younger players in the second half of the season bodes well for the future. The second men's team also had a difficult time in the very competitive North Division 1 league but have done well enough to avoid relegation. Once again, the younger players have brought both energy and quality to the team performances. Given the emerging prominence of younger players in the senior teams , it is no surprise that our under !7 team reached the semifinals of the junior Mactavish cup and decisively picked up the Mowi London Shield league trophy at the end of the season (2/11/24) Likewise the U17 Development Team, which also includes on some of our young women players, won the WJ Cameron Trophy on 27/11/10 following a league and knock out competition. The women players were in action in the National Senior League, the North 2 nd Division and the U14's "Round Robin" competitions. The National Team consolidated there position mid table in the league and the Norh 2 team did us proud by coming top in a hard fought League who scored 27goals in18 games in the North 2 league placing her as top scorer in that league. For representative games, Glenurquhart had two under17 youth players selected to play for a Scottish select in Ireland. In addition 5 senior women and 6 junior women were selected for the East and west representative games heald annually in Oban. The 3 day Youth summer "camp" took place in July at Blairbeg Park. This event is open to for all local primary school children in Aird and Loch Ness. It was oversubscribed and well attended with playe

	Club Minibus - has now been relocated to the High School to be kept adjacent to the School minibus. Both buses are being used extensively by several local community organisations subject to prior booking and driver vetting. This has been achieved by significantly strengthening our partnership ties with Glenurquhart High School
	Old Shop Site, Balmacaan Road, Drumnadrochit GUSC in partnership with Glenurquhart Rural Community Association, Glenurquhart Rugby Club and Glenurquhart Football Club , have succeeded in a bid to the Scottish Land Fund for a grant to assist in the outright purchase by the Community of this plot adjacent to Blairbeg Park for a health and wellbeing centre. The legal details are in the process of being finalised.

Financial review

Brief statement of the charity's policy on reserves

GUSC (SCIO) is a volunteer lead organisation with no employees and hence our reserves requirement is relatively modest.

For the sake of good order, it is the intention of the Trustees to retain sufficient funds in the clubs accounts to cover the recurring annual fixed costs and regular services for the forthcoming season without any immediate requirement to fund raise.

For season 2024 services provided on a demand basis are for laundry , clubhouse cleaning and perimeter grass cutting which, on average ,amount to £1500 in total. The recurring predictable costs for competition entries, minibus insurance , utilities, minor maintenance, property & liability insurance currently amount to approximately £5000. Hence our 2023 reserves Policy was therefore to retain a minimum of £9000 in our accessible accounts at year end.

However, as a result of increased costs in all areas and particularly in insurance products and utilities, we wil be monitoring our fixed costs closely during 2025 with a view to adjusting our reserves policy as required.

There are no deficits to record and no immediate future risks identified as at year ending October 2024
