Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

Staged a multi-event running festival featuring a half-marathon road race, an approximately 8 km trail run, event village for families and a children's fun run.

Retained the previous year's more accessible trail course in response to positive participant feedback.

Partnered with local sports clubs, schools, Scouts and Guides to recruit and coordinate volunteer support.

Collaborated with local community groups to provide route-side entertainment and encouragement.

Invited local community organisations and businesses to take part in the event village.

Increased public engagement through social media with marketing and awareness campaigns to better inform the local community about road closures and providing route related help for residents and businesses.

Partnered with charity partner Maggie's to raise their profile, encourage runners to secure sponsorship and facilitate on-the-day donations.

Other optional information

Our flagship half-marathon once again attracted a strong and diverse field — from veteran members of local running clubs to many athletes tackling the distance for the first time. We have always been committed to promoting diversity, inclusion, and accessibility across all our events, and were particularly proud this year to welcome our first non-binary entrant in the half-marathon. Along the route, the runners were encouraged by many enthusiastic residents who helped create an upbeat and supportive atmosphere for everyone involved.

The revised 8 km trail event, routed through nearby woodland paths, also drew runners of all abilities. Some participants progressed from “Couch to 5K” programmes to take on the off-road challenge, while others enjoyed their first experience of trail running. Feedback was overwhelmingly positive, with many highlighting the scenic course, welcoming atmosphere, and supportive volunteers.

The non-competitive children’s fun run once again proved to be a highlight of the weekend, attracting an excellent turnout of young participants and delighted families. The finish area was filled with proud smiles and a strong sense of achievement among the children.

The event’s success was made possible thanks to the dedication of our volunteers, drawn from all sections of the community. This diverse team included fellow runners, local youth groups, adults with disabilities, and residents of all ages, who came together to ensure the smooth running of the weekend and to foster a warm, inclusive environment for participants and spectators alike.

We continued to strengthen our commitment to environmental responsibility by introducing additional sustainability measures. Notably, leftover race T-shirts were collected and donated to charitable causes, ensuring that surplus stock was put to good use rather than going to waste.

The event benefited from extensive promotion across social media platforms and live coverage on our local community radio station, helping us engage with a wider audience across Kirkcaldy and the surrounding area.

We are extremely grateful to our financial supporters, whose generous contributions enabled the event to take place. These included Fife Council, our local authority, as well as a cross-section of local businesses who continue to recognise the value of the festival in bringing the community together and promoting health and wellbeing.

Our committee was extended with the welcome addition of new members, many of whom took on roles and responsibilities which were new to them, picking up new skills along the way and every one of them contributed to the delivery of the events over the weekend.

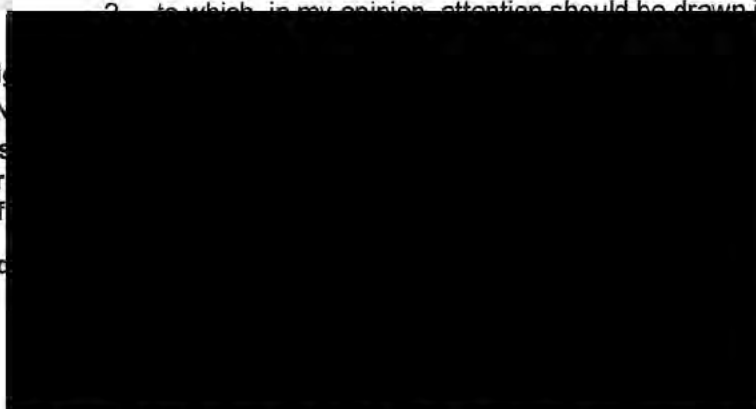
