Objectives and activities

K9 Miracles charity was inspired by my dog Miracle and my son [REDACTED] who has cerebral palsy and autism.

Both human and K9 struggled through life and the journey for both has been very difficult.

Miracle was a victim of the illegal dog meat trade, who accidentally became emotional support to [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] and Miracles story [REDACTED] attracted international attention raising awareness of the horrors of the illegal dog meat trade.

K9 Miracles aims to relieve animal suffering, providing aid and care where logistically possible.

Working with rescuers and charities around the world who share our vision and values.

The work we carry out includes spay and neuter projects which are hugely important.

This work is carried out to minimise over population of stray animals being born into a life of hardship on the streets.

We look at improving the welfare of animals by educating the public, raising awareness of animal suffering whilst promoting compassion and change.

On occasion we have found animals with injuries and trauma so severe, we have had no option but to remove them from street life, provide veterinary care and look for loving homes in the UK.

Structure, governance and management

K9 Miracles is a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation

Established 16/01/2023

Governed by the rules set out in our constitution.

Charitable purposes set out in our Constitution

*To promote the advancement of animal welfare and to provide education on animal welfare.

*Provide aid, care and protection to animals in need worldwide.

*Working with rescuers and charities around the world who share our vision and values.

*Conduct spay/Neuter campaigns to minimise overpopulation of stray animals.

*Help animals in need to find adoptive families, connecting animals and people for the benefit of both.

*To advocate for the emotional support animals can give to people and benefit their wellbeing.

Trustee recruitment and appointment

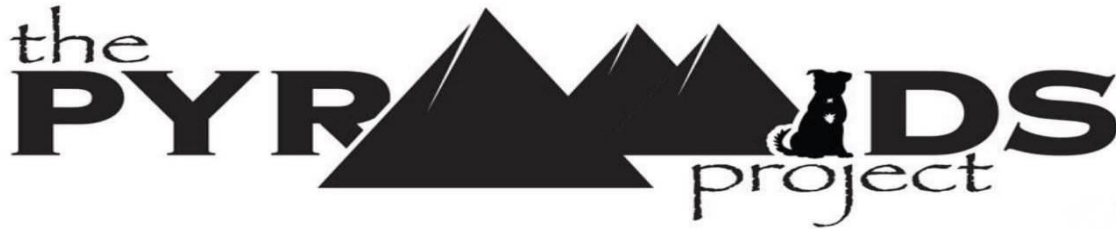
This year we have added 1 trustee.

Although we intended to recruit a further 5 trustees, we have not been able to find people with the skill sets we require to move the charity forward.

We will continue to seek out compassionate individuals who share our vision of a better world for all Animals.

Achievements and performance

On being granted charity registration, our first project took us to Egypt.



The inspiration and necessity for this spay/neuter project was due to a previous trip to the Giza Pyramids and being shocked at the hundreds of dog's living there.

Authorities view dogs as a problem.

The decision was taken to carry out culls and poison many dogs. Whilst that is not only inhumane, it's not a solution as dogs from the desert or surrounding areas will move in and take up residence. Removing all dogs from the Pyramids would mean the snake, rodent and insect population would rise as they are a source of food for dogs.

K9 Miracles in collaboration with ESMA (Egyptian society for mercy to animals) worked together to benefit the dogs of the Pyramids.

Achievements

K9 Miracles was the first charity organisation to neuter 50 dogs at the Pyramids.

The dogs were tagged and treated with Bravecto for Tick related diseases.

The dogs were vaccinated to prevent Rabies.

This project was a benefit not only to the dogs but also the tourists who want to interact and feed the starving dogs.

Whilst the focus was TNVR of Pyramid dogs and the majority of the dogs treated were able to be released back to their territories in the Pyramids, unfortunately due old age and complications in surgery the decision was made not to release 2 of the dogs back to the Pyramids but prepare them for travel to the UK for adoption.

This year K9 miracles donated 2 watering stations to be installed on the land surrounding the Pyramids of Giza. These stations provide vital water for stray animals living in the shadows of the Pyramids.

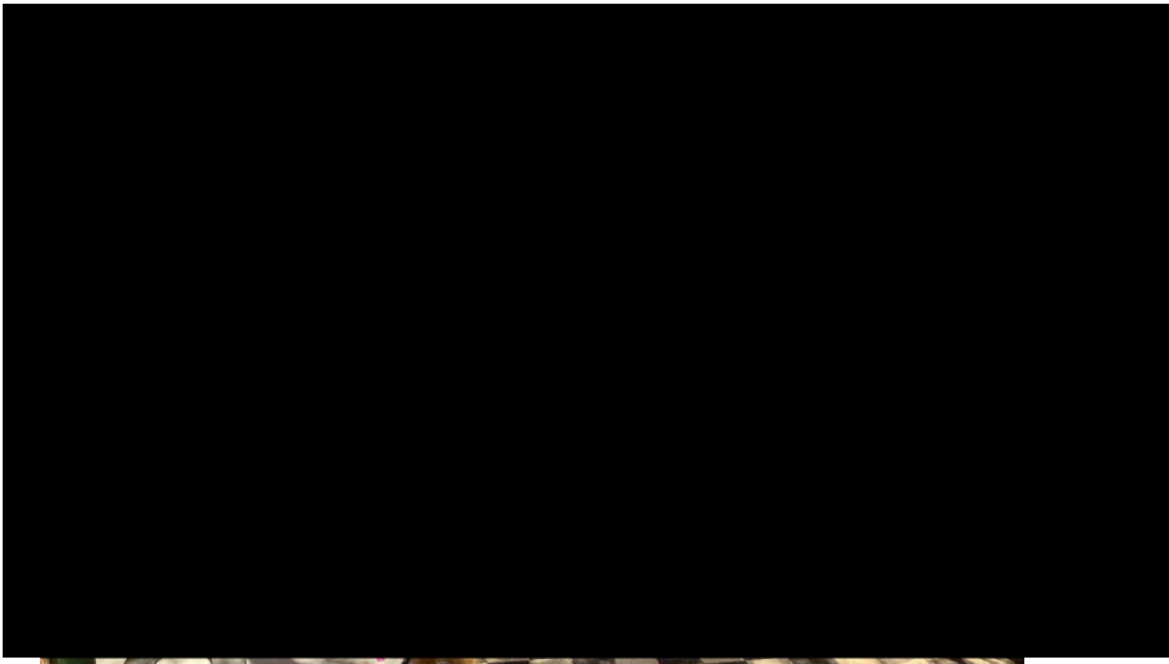
Achievements and education.

Due to war breaking out in the Middle East, our presence on the ground in Egypt has been limited this year. We had to deal with our rescue work from afar, it simply was not safe to travel to Cairo and have volunteers working in the field.

This did present challenges, but did not stop our work, caring for our animals.

Although the dogs in our care received all the vet treatment and aftercare that they required, they were not able to travel to their new homes.

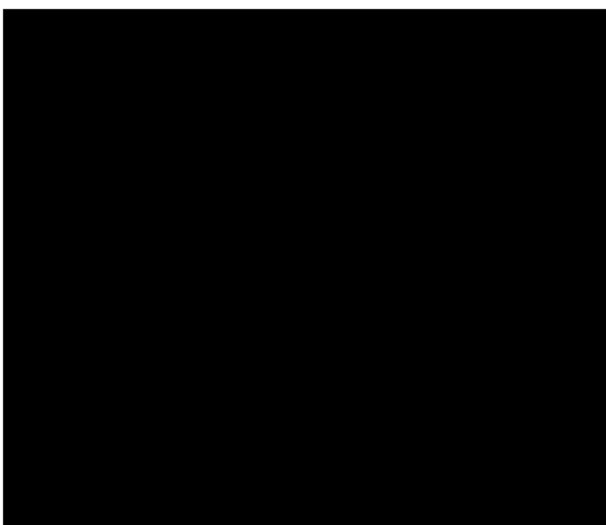
Because of this we have had no choice but to pay for boarding facilities, which has proven to be expensive.



K9 Miracles have also saved 14 dogs who endured some of the worst injuries imaginable.

5 of these dogs required amputation due to all they endured while others were victims of acid attacks. Putting these dogs back onto the streets was not an option!

After veterinary treatment and rehabilitation, they are now boarding while we fundraise their travel to the UK where we aim to find them the futures they deserve.

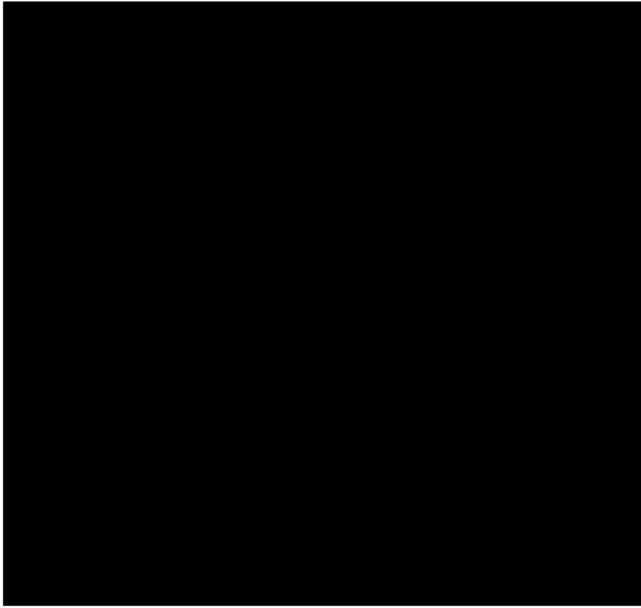


This is Bulbul (Meaning a type of bird)

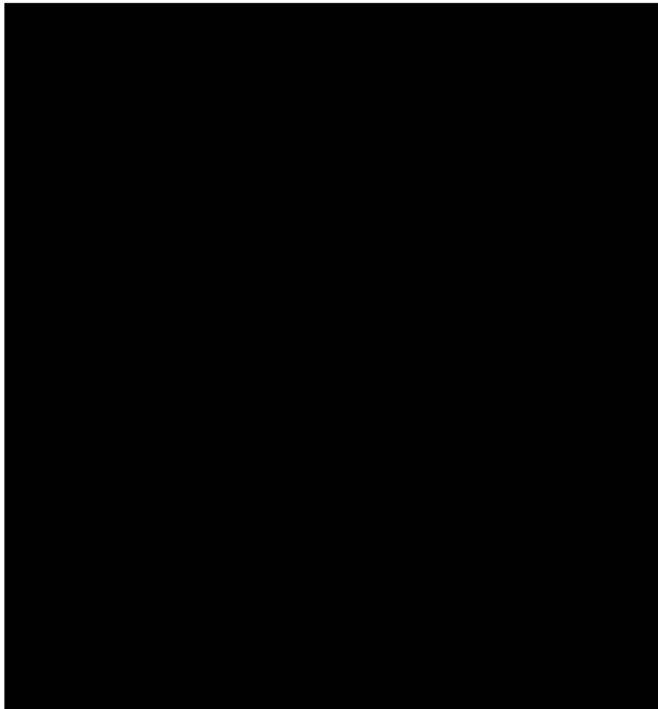
Bulbul suffered so badly at the hands of humans yet now craves human hands to comfort him.

Reserves Policy

K9 Miracles should hold a minimum of 10% annual turnover up to the value of £10,000 in reserve.

This was not achieved.

Although this is against policy the decision was made by the trustees that because our standing liabilities are very low, the funds were better used where needed rather than being held in reserve this year.

Future plans

K9 Miracles will continue to work on the ever-important TNR projects around the world

Where logistically possible and we remain committed to helping Egyptian animals.

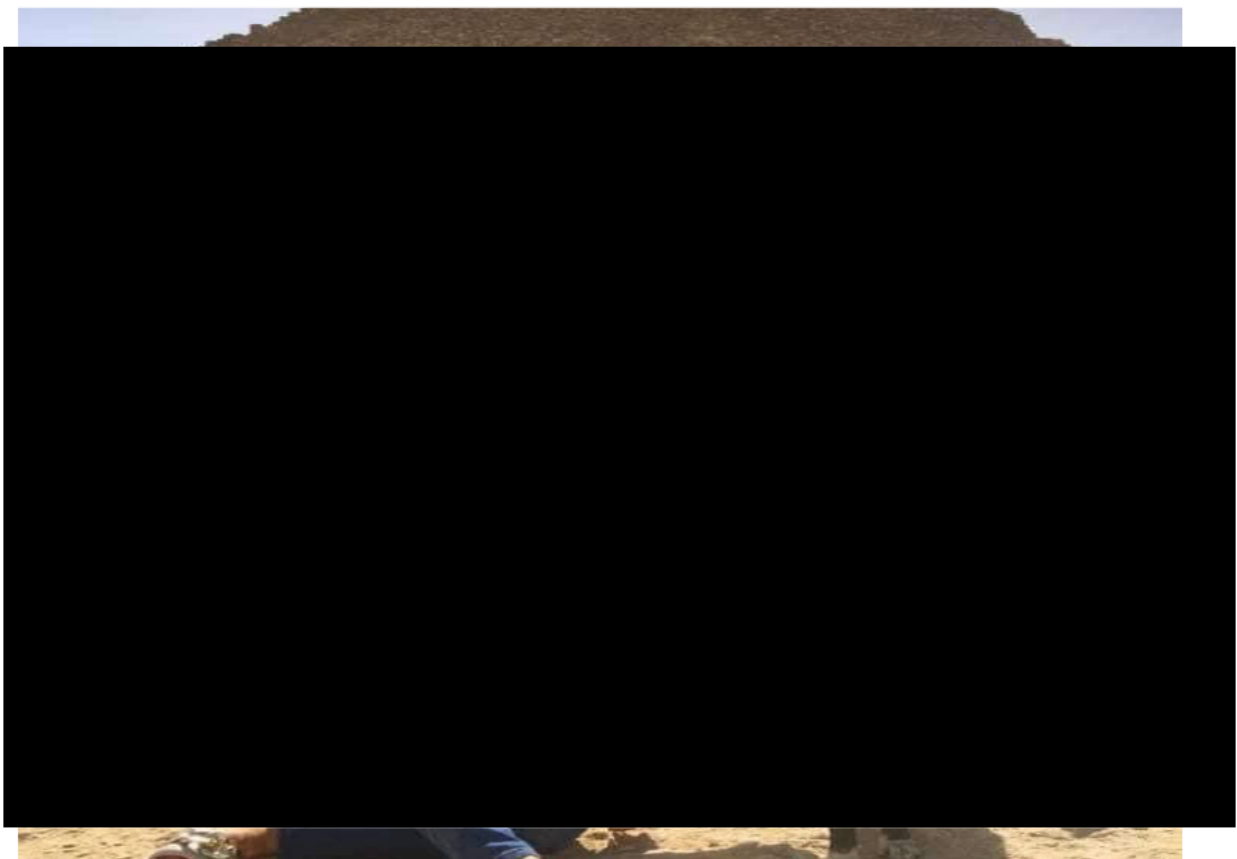
Our focus for now must be for us to raise the necessary funds to prepare our 14 dogs currently in boarding facilities who are waiting until their time comes to travel to the UK.

This will be achieved through various fundraising events and social media campaigns.

There are various organisations providing care for working horses and Donkeys but sadly there is no animal welfare offered to Camels whatsoever.

K9 Miracles would like to explore possibilities of how best we can offer aid/welfare to the majestic ships of the desert.

This little dog was named "Cairo" and was the first dog to greet our founder [REDACTED] when she first visited the Pyramids. She was so thirsty that she drank water from her hands. Cairo was the inspiration for the Pyramids project.
