OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

Blantyre Celtic Community Football Club SCIO aims to enhance the lives of children and young people through football training and matches. We strive to promote public participation in football, offering a safe, inclusive, and competitive environment accessible to all.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

- Hosted our first full club presentation night at Celtic Park, attended by 600 people.
- Held our 9th annual football festival across two venues.
- Secured £4,000 in funding from the National Lottery Community Fund.
- Completed a successful recruitment drive, increasing membership from 180 to 250 players.
- Provided new training kits and match wear for all 250 players, alongside new trainingbags for each player and updated kits for all coaches.
- Organised a full club Tinto Hill climb fundraiser via GoFundMe, raising over £3,000.
- Expanded our female football programme by adding two new girls' age groups

FUTURE PLANS

- Plan to add three new teams, increasing participation to over 300 players.
- Celebrate our 10th annual football festival.
- · Launch a recruitment drive for female volunteer coaches.
- Expand participation in football festivals across Scotland, England, and the Netherlands.
- · Work towards achieving the SFA's Gold Quality Mark status.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.
