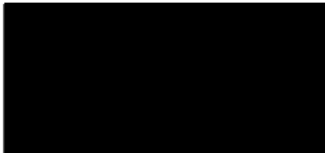
HISTORY

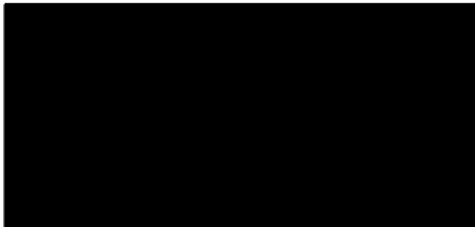
CHARITY INFORMATION

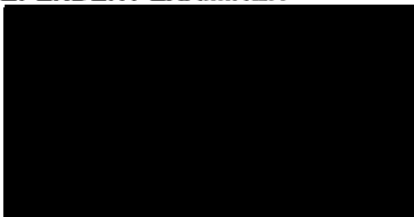
SELECTION OF TRUSTEES

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES

Introduction

This is the first Annual Report of Go Global Family as a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (SCIO), formally established on 29 August 2023. As this report covers an initial extended period of eighteen months (from 1 September 2023 to 28 February 2025), it provides an opportunity to reflect both on our beginnings and on the growth and development that has taken place since then.

Go Global Family exists to **make disciples, establish churches, release ministries, and support leaders**. These aims remain at the heart of all that we do, and during this first reporting period we are grateful to have seen encouraging progress in each of these areas. It is our hope that this report will give confidence to our supporters and inspire new ones as we share the story of what has been accomplished so far and where we are heading.

Charitable Objectives

The purposes of Go Global Family, as set out in the SCIO constitution, are:

- To **advance the Christian faith** in accordance with the teachings of the Bible for the benefit of the public.
- To **relieve poverty and distress** and promote the welfare of individuals and families through the provision of support, training, and resources.
- To **advance education**, particularly in areas relating to Christian leadership, theology, and community development.
- To do all such other charitable things as are consistent with the above purposes.

These objectives guide the work of Go Global Family and provide the framework by which the trustees evaluate activity and impact.

Establishing Go Global Family

From the outset, Go Global Family was begun with a vision to connect and equip leaders across nations, strengthening churches and supporting those called to lead in their local contexts. The SCIO structure has given us the foundation to operate with accountability and transparency while pursuing this vision. During these early months, key structures were put in place, including the appointment of **trustees**, the formation of a **strategic leadership team**, and the establishment of an **apostolic team** providing spiritual oversight and direction. Together with regular rhythms of prayer, training, and communication, these groups have been vital in creating stability and vision for the work.

Growth and Connection

Throughout this period, leaders across the Go Global Family have been encouraged, churches built up, and new initiatives launched to equip people for the future.

- Leaders have gathered globally on **bi-monthly Zoom calls** to train, share, and build together.
- The **strategic team** has met monthly to oversee ongoing direction and strategy.
- **Trustees** have met bi-monthly to provide governance, guidance, and accountability.
- The **apostolic team** has continued to bring spiritual input and oversight, helping to ensure that Go Global Family stays rooted in its vision and values.
- Two **Global Leaders Days** were hosted in March and October 2024, giving churches across the network an opportunity to hear updates and celebrate together.
- In March 2025, leaders from across the UK gathered in person at **Londrick Muir** for a weekend of teaching, worship, and community — a time that was both refreshing and strengthening.

Prayer and Intercession

Prayer has been central to our life together. In January 2024, we joined with believers worldwide in a week of prayer and fasting. Later in the year, a dedicated **intercessory prayer group**, led by B [REDACTED] was launched and now meets monthly to pray for the work of Go Global and wider global concerns.

Training and Global Classroom

One of the most significant steps forward has been the launch of **Global Classroom** in January 2024, an online training platform designed to equip people through structured courses.

- The platform began with *Powers That Control* [REDACTED] and *Clarity, Communication and Choice* ([REDACTED]).
- Since then, **9 courses** have been delivered, with encouraging participation and impact. Other courses are planned.

Alongside this, we introduced a **monthly newsletter** which now reaches around 226 subscribers, keeping our growing network connected with updates, highlights, and encouragement.

International Missions & Training

Equipping leaders in different nations has remained a vital part of our work. Each year, [REDACTED] has travelled to **India and Africa**, often accompanied by leaders he is mentoring. These trips provide opportunities for both direct teaching and for developing future trainers.

In 2024, conferences were hosted in **India, Nepal, and Africa**, gathering pastors for teaching, encouragement, and practical equipping. These events continue to strengthen local churches and build capacity for long-term growth.

Financial Review and Reserves Policy

Almost all the income (97%) came from donations from individuals, churches and companies. The largest single item of expenditure was staff costs (45% of the total). The results for the period ended 28 February 2025 are given in the Statement of Financial Activities, together with the Balance Sheet and Notes, on pages 7 to 11. Unrestricted funds carried forward now total £36,135, with restricted funds amounting to £3,674.

The trustees seek to maintain a constant surplus approximately equivalent to three months of costs. The operating reserves are currently £27,000.

Looking Ahead

As we move forward, we remain committed to building, equipping, and releasing leaders across the nations. Looking to 2025, our focus includes:

- Further development of **Global Classroom**.
- Strengthening prayer and intercession.
- Deepening **regional connections**.
- Continuing to support churches and leaders as they grow in their mission.

The trustees are encouraged by the progress made during this first extended reporting period and are confident of continued growth, impact, and faithful service in the years ahead.

TRUSTEES' RESPONSIBILITIES

Under legislation relating to charities in Scotland, the Trustees are required to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of its incoming resources and application of resources, including its surplus or deficit for that year, and which have been properly prepared from and are in agreement with the accounting records of the charity.

In preparing those financial statements, the Trustees are required to:

- Select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently.
- Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent.
- Prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue its activities.

The Trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records, which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the charity's financial position. These financial statements comply with the requirements of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended), and Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland (FRS 102). The Trustees are also responsible for taking such steps as are reasonably open to them to safeguard the charity's assets, and for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

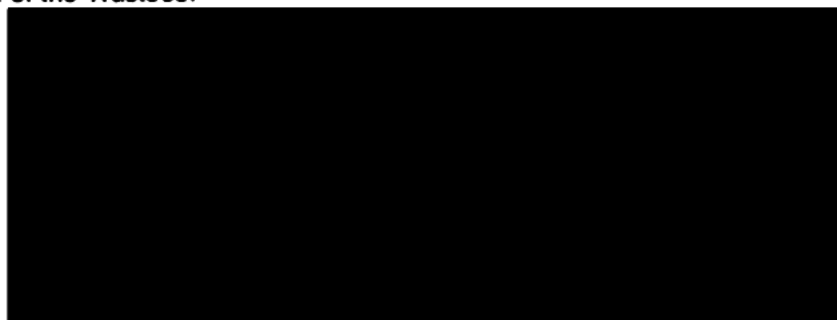

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES OF GO GLOBAL FAMILY

I report on the accounts of the charity for the period ended 28th February 2025, which are set out on pages 7 to 11.

Respective responsibilities of Trustees and Examiner

The charity's Trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended). The charity Trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1) (a) to (c) of the Accounts Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under section 44(1) (c) of the Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of Independent Examiner's statement

My examination is carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended). An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts and seeks explanations from the Trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and, consequently, I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.

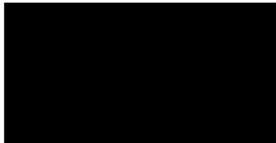

1. Accounting policies

Accounting convention

Financial Statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and under the guidelines as laid down in the Statement of Recommended Practice for Accounting and Reporting by Charities (FRS 102).

Charity income

Income is accounted for when received.

Restricted and Unrestricted Funds

For the purpose of the Statement of Financial Activities and the Balance Sheet, these funds are defined as follows:

Unrestricted funds – Gifts and other income received for the objects of the charity without specified purpose and available as general funds. They are subdivided into two: **Designated** funds, where a purpose has been allocated by the Trustees, and which can later be changed by the Trustees as required; and **Undesignated** or **General** funds.

Restricted funds – Gifts and other income received for purposes as specified by the donor.
