SUMMARY PURPOSE STATEMENT

Go Global is an apostolic family of churches based in Edinburgh, Scotland. Go Global is intentionally building a family where disciples of Jesus are multiplied, healthy churches and healthy leaders are established, ministries are released and empowered, and leaders are supported and mentored. Go Global has a conviction to do all this with a deep passion to “remember the poor” (Galatians 2:10) and to be catalysts for unity in the wider Body of Christ.

HISTORY

Go Global was established informally in 2021 by Peter Anderson with a team of likeminded leaders, although the relational roots in many cases go back much further. It became a SCIO in 2023.

CHARITY INFORMATION

Go Global Family is established as a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (SCIO), and is a Scottish Charity identified under reference number SC052784. The charity is generally known by the shortened name Go Global.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES

Introduction

Go Global Family exists to make disciples, establish churches, release ministries, and strengthen leaders. These aims remain at the heart of all that we do, and throughout the reporting period from 1st March to 31st December 2025 we have continued to strengthen relationships, equip leaders, and serve churches across the nations. We are grateful for God's faithfulness during another year of ministry and are encouraged by the opportunities that lie ahead.

It is our hope that this report gives confidence to our supporters and provides an overview of the work and impact of Go Global Family during the reporting period.

Charitable Objectives

The purposes of Go Global Family, as set out in the SCIO constitution, are:

- To **advance the Christian faith** in accordance with the teachings of the Bible for the benefit of the public.
- To **relieve poverty and distress** and promote the welfare of individuals and families through the provision of support, training, and resources.
- To **advance education**, particularly in areas relating to Christian leadership, theology, and community development.
- To do all such other charitable things as are consistent with the above purposes.

These objectives guide the work of Go Global Family and provide the framework by which the trustees evaluate activity and impact.

Establishing Go Global Family

Go Global Family was established with a vision to make disciples, establish churches, release ministries, and strengthen leaders across the nations. The SCIO structure continues to provide a strong foundation for accountable governance while enabling the charity to pursue this vision with clarity and purpose.

Throughout the reporting period, the Trustees, Strategic Leadership Team, and Apostolic Team have continued to work together to provide governance, spiritual oversight, and strategic direction. Alongside regular rhythms of prayer, training, and communication, these structures continue to support the healthy development of the charity.

Growth and Connection

Throughout this reporting period, relationships across the Go Global Family have continued to strengthen as leaders have been encouraged, churches have been equipped, and opportunities for collaboration have continued to grow.

- Trustees met bi-monthly, providing governance, accountability, and oversight.
- The Strategic Leadership Team met monthly to oversee the ongoing direction and development of the charity.
- The Apostolic Team met bi-monthly, providing spiritual oversight, encouragement, and support to leaders and churches across the Go Global Family.
- In April 2025, leaders from across the UK gathered at Lendrick Muir for a weekend of worship, biblical teaching, fellowship, and encouragement. This gathering strengthened relationships and invested in those leading churches across the UK.
- During the year, the existing Leadership Hub evolved into a new rhythm of Global Hubs and Regional Hubs. Global Hubs now meet every second month, bringing together leaders from across the Go Global Family to share vision, teaching, ministry updates, and testimonies. In the alternate months, Regional Hubs meet, enabling leaders to strengthen relationships within their own regions, encourage one another, and focus on local opportunities and challenges.
- Regular video updates were also introduced, helping churches and leaders around the world remain connected with the vision, ministry updates, and stories of what God is doing across the Go Global Family.

Prayer and Intercession

Prayer continues to be central to the life and ministry of Go Global Family. Monthly intercessory prayer gatherings, led by Emperor Lawson, have continued throughout the year, bringing together leaders and intercessors from different nations to pray for churches, mission, and global needs. Prayer also remains an integral part of our Global Hubs, Regional Hubs, conferences, and ministry activities, recognising our dependence upon God in every aspect of the charity's work.

Training and Global Classroom

The Global Classroom has continued to develop as an important platform for biblical teaching and leadership development. New teaching resources have been added, equipping leaders and churches across multiple nations. The platform continues to make biblical and leadership training accessible regardless of geographical location.

There is much more to be done in this regard. Plans are actively being developed to expand the training initiatives.

International Missions & Training

International ministry continued to expand throughout the reporting period as Go Global Family strengthened existing partnerships and established new opportunities for mission and leadership development. Regular ministry visits continued to India and Uganda, where teams from Go Global Family worked alongside local churches to host leadership conferences for pastors and church leaders. These gatherings provided biblical teaching, leadership development, encouragement, and opportunities to strengthen relationships with leaders serving across each region.

Alongside the established partnerships, regular mission trips continued to Poland, while new ministry initiatives were established in Nepal and Uganda. These visits provided opportunities to teach, encourage pastors, strengthen churches, mentor leaders, and build long-term ministry relationships. During the year, Go Global Family also celebrated the completion of church building projects in India, Pakistan, Nigeria, and Uganda. These projects have provided permanent places for worship, discipleship, leadership training, and community outreach, enabling local churches to continue serving their communities effectively.

Through these partnerships and ministry opportunities, Go Global Family continues to fulfil its vision of making disciples, establishing churches, releasing ministries, and strengthening leaders across the nations.

Financial Review and Reserves Policy

During the reporting period, 68% of the income came from church donations and a further 23% from donations from individuals. Some Gift Aid could be claimed for the first time. Altogether, 95% of the income was donation related. The largest single item of expenditure was staff costs (43% of the total). The results for the period ended 31st December 2025 are given in the Statement of Financial Activities, together with the Balance Sheet and Notes, on pages 7 to 12. Unrestricted funds carried forward now total £37,550, with restricted funds amounting to £31,470.

The trustees seek to maintain a constant surplus approximately equivalent to three months of costs. The operating reserves are currently £27,000.

Looking Ahead

As we move into 2026, we remain committed to making disciples, establishing churches, releasing ministries, and strengthening leaders across the nations. We look forward to continuing the development of the Global Classroom, strengthening Global Hubs and Regional Hubs, expanding international mission opportunities, investing in leadership development, and building stronger partnerships with churches around the world.

The trustees remain grateful for God's faithfulness throughout the year and are encouraged by the continued growth of Go Global Family as we seek to serve churches, strengthen leaders, and fulfil our charitable objectives.

TRUSTEES' RESPONSIBILITIES

Under legislation relating to charities in Scotland, the Trustees are required to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of its incoming resources and application of resources, including its surplus or deficit for that year, and which have been properly prepared from and are in agreement with the accounting records of the charity.

In preparing those financial statements, the Trustees are required to:

- Select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently.
- Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent.
- Prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue its activities.

The Trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records, which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the charity's financial position. These financial statements comply with the requirements of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended), and Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland (FRS 102). The Trustees are also responsible for taking such steps as are reasonably open to them to safeguard the charity's assets, and for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

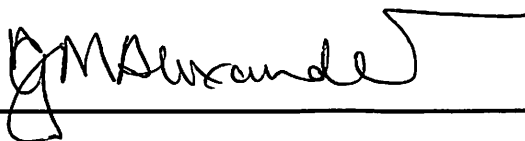

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES OF GO GLOBAL FAMILY

I report on the accounts of the charity for the period ended 31st December 2025, which are set out on pages 7 to 12.

Respective responsibilities of Trustees and Examiner

The charity's Trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended). The charity Trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1) (a) to (c) of the Accounts Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under section 44(1) (c) of the Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of Independent Examiner's statement

My examination is carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended). An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts and seeks explanations from the Trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and, consequently, I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.

Independent Examiner's statement

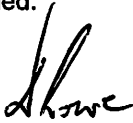

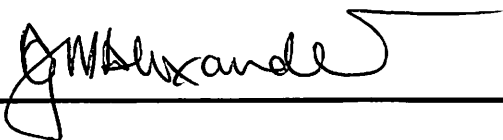

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Period Ended 31st December 2025

1. Accounting policies

Accounting convention

Financial Statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and under the guidelines as laid down in the Statement of Recommended Practice for Accounting and Reporting by Charities (FRS 102).

Charity income

Income is accounted for when received.

Restricted and Unrestricted Funds

For the purpose of the Statement of Financial Activities and the Balance Sheet, these funds are defined as follows:

Unrestricted funds – Gifts and other income received for the objects of the charity without specified purpose and available as general funds. They are subdivided into two: **Designated** funds, where a purpose has been allocated by the Trustees, and which can later be changed by the Trustees as required; and **Undesignated** or **General** funds.

Restricted funds – Gifts and other income received for purposes as specified by the donor.
