## Achievements and performance

### Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

Nairn Sailing Club provides a range of activities to support its purposes, including sailing events such as dinghy sailing sessions with support vessels, cruiser racing and a schedule of social events.

All activities and events are open to members and their guests, and the club occasionally invites non members to events, such as interesting talks in the Clubhouse e.g. Coastguard Presentation, Cold Water Shock Talk.

Since April 2024 we have run two full seasons of Cruiser Racing with 1+ races completed, including a variety of crews participating.

During Summer 2025 six Dinghy Sessions were scheduled with a growing number of participants. The Club is focussing on growing the dinghy sailing as it can bring many physical and mental health benefits to participants, and this is planned to increase during 2026.

There have been more than 15 Social Events involving members and guests, ranging from Quiz Nights to Summer BBQs to visits to a local Port that has been redeveloped for the offshore wind industry. We also run an Open Day which is for the benefit of the Public, unfortunately the planned boat trips were cancelled due to inclement weather however members of the public were invited to board our members vessels to familiarise themselves with sailing yachts.

In addition, NSC supports other local charitable clubs such as Nairn Coastal Rowing, Nairn Kayak Club and Triathlon Group in providing facilities and volunteers to support their activities which benefit the residents of Nairn. Our Clubhouse is frequently used by other clubs for their events and we provide on the water support to clubs such as Kayak Club when they run events.

## Financial review

### Brief statement of the charity's policy on reserves

The Club has a Current Treasurers Account for day to day club management and has 3 months operating expensed ringfenced in a separate savings account.

### Details of any deficit

We have a deficit of £5176 for the 16 months since becoming a charity, this is mainly down to electrical works in the Clubhouse to bring them up to date, along with overdue boiler service and the addition of new smoke and heat detectors.
