Structure, governance and management

Type of governing document

The White Feather is governed by its constitution which established the objects and powers of the charity.

Trustee recruitment and appointment

A person will not be eligible for election or appointment to the Board unless they are a member of the White Feather.
A person will not be eligible for election or appointment to the Board if they are:

- Disqualified from being a charity trustee under the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005; or
- An employee of the White Feather.

At each Annual General Meeting, the members may elect any member to be a charity trustee.

The Board may at any time appoint any member to be a charity trustee.
At each Annual general Meeting, all of the charity trustees must retire from office but may then be re-elected.

Objectives and activities

Charitable purposes

The White Feather was established for the purposes of the saving of lives, the advancement of health and the relief of those in need by reason of age, ill health, disability and other disadvantage. It aims to assist people in Scotland by providing supplies and equipment to support and care for all in need.

Summary of the main activities in relation to these objects

The main activities undertaken by the White Feather to meet these objectives include the following:

- Holding fundraising events;
- Seeking out contributions and donations from individuals and companies; and
- Sourcing grants from grant-making organisations.

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Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

Since the charity was founded, we have been successful in making people and businesses aware of what we are trying to achieve, by directly and immediately helping the people who need aid the most, as opposed to donating money to be included in a main charity 'pot' which will eventually be diluted before trickling down to help the people.

We ensure everyone knows that whatever money we raise is utilised to purchase items to assist the charity or cause of our choosing. We select suitable causes and ask the charities to advise why they should receive our help and then the committee meet and discuss which cause to support.

We then ascertain what items are required and then we source the cost of said items and then set out to fundraise to enable purchase. White Feather CA is transparent at all times and therefore our supporters always know what cause we are funding for.

Since October 2024 we have raised monies towards the purchase of a crucial item for the undernoted well deserving cause:

- Chest Heart & Stroke Scotland - Donated £3,500.00

This payment was made to Ms Anne Magarin of Chest Heart & Stroke Scotland towards the purchase of a Bodi Trax machine which makes it easy to check body statistics and will point out risk factors, so people can act quickly to reduce risks and avoid chest, heart and stroke conditions.

We have pledged to raise £10,000 in order that Chest Heart & Stroke Scotland, can purchase the Bodi Trax machine and turn this dream into reality.

Whilst we were unable to raise the full amount this year, we intend to continue to fundraise on their behalf, in 2026, to pay the balance in order that they Bodi Tax machine can be purchased.

Throughout the period 01/11/2024 – 31/10/2025, we held two events:

- Disco - Wellcroft Bowling Club, Glasgow
- Charity Ball - Crossbasket Castle

In addition, we have received several cash donations and donations from supporters who baked and sold cakes and tablet, taken part in sponsored events, on our behalf. We have already secured dates for fundraising events for the year 01/11/2025 - 31/10/2026 as follows:

- Fraser Adams & Laura Hogg - Kilt Walk - 26 April 2026
- Disco - Wellcroft Bowling Club - 6 June 2026
- Charity Ball - Crossbasket Castle - 31 October 2026
