Structure, Governance and Management

Constitution

The Charity is a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (SCIO). It was registered in its current legal form on 22 September 2016

Appointment of Trustees

The Board of Trustees are the Charity Trustees

A person will not be eligible for election or appointment to the board if he/she is: -

- 1 disqualified from being a Charity Trustee under the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005; or
- 2 an employee of the organisation.

New Trustees are elected at the Annual General Meeting which normally is held in November. There must be a minimum of 5 and maximum of 12 Trustees. At each Annual General Meeting one third of our existing Trustees will stand down.

Objects and Activities

Charitable Purposes

- The provision of recreational facilities, or the organisation of recreational activities with the object of improving the conditions of life for the persons for whom the facilities or activities are primarily intended by hosting recreational events and activities that provide opportunities for the community to come together.
- The relief of those in need by reason of age, ill-health, disability, financial hardship or other disadvantage through the provision of small grants, donations or support to community groups, charities and individuals.
- Create greater community cohesion and the advancement of community development by initiating new or improving existing facilities and activities for local communities to participate in.

Activities

- Organise and host events and leisure activities for sections, or the whole community to participate in.
- Undertake a range of fundraising activities.
- Getting more people involved in their local community through promoting volunteering.
- Creation of community-based activities such as, but not limited to, Men's Shed and a memorial wall.
- Provision of small grants.
- Involve members of the local community in finding solutions to previously identified needs, e.g. social isolation.

Achievements and Performance

We donated £50.00 to East Lothian Foodbank in January. This was the final part of a £150.00 donation agreed by the trustees but had to be done in stages. We also donated £250.00 to Lily's CIC Ormiston and £250.00 to Tranent Youth Facility in December 2025.

A total of £350.00 was raised during a sponsored Beetle Drive during the year and £845.50 was also raised at a Clairvoyant Night during the year.

In 2025, we stayed involved in the Ormiston community, and participated in the Ormiston Flower Show.

We have a pitch side advertising board at Ormiston Primrose Football Club for Season 2025/2026 at a cost of £100.00.

We were pleased to work closely with Ormiston Children's Gala week. They have not required a monetary donation for the last couple of years, but we remain a sponsor. They continue to display our marketing boards, and we have an advertisement in their programme of events.

Our chairperson volunteers with the Gala committee, she puts together the paper programme, helps with their social media and is part of the organisation of the week's events.

We were also delighted to be able to again sponsor the A Gift from Kieran football competition as part of the Gala week. The winner's trophy was bought by the gala committee years ago and is re-used each year. We attend and present the trophy on behalf of A Gift from Kieran.

At this time A Gift from Kieran does not hold any reserves.

Plans for the Future

In 2026, we aim to enhance our community involvement once again. We will participate in Ormiston's Gala Week festivities.

Previously, our darts, dominoes, and bowling competitions were highly successful. We are currently in discussions with local groups to revive these events or introduce similar activities.

We plan to continue our sponsorship of Ormiston Primrose Football Club and are exploring a joint venture to organise a football tournament.
