#### **Trustees' Annual Report**

The trustees present their report and annual accounts for the year ended 31 December 2023

#### **Structure, Governance and Management**

#### **Governing Document**

North Berwick Football Club is an unincorporated association that is governed by its Constitution and was granted charitable status on the 29 August 2018. The charity is registered in Scotland with the office of the Scottish Charity Regulator (OSCR), with charity number SC048664.

#### Appointment and Recruitment of Trustees

The charity is managed on a day to day basis by the trustees, who are volunteers. No salary or remuneration was paid to the trustees for management of the club.

The trustees are elected, for a one year term, by the majority of members attending the AGM. All Office bearers will retire at the end of every year but are eligible for re-election at the AGM

#### Organisational Structure

Membership of the Club shall be of three classes: Team membership – Developmental Football – ages 3 to 11 Team membership – Youth Football – ages 12 to 21 Player membership – ages 3 to 21

All member teams are managed by the team management committee, for that age group, approved by the Executive Committee. The team management committee to be not less than two in number and at least one member of the team management committee should have current possession of a Scottish Football Association Coaching Certificate of relevant standard and a current First Aid Certificate or Sports Injuries Certificate or should obtain such certificates within six months from the team's initial acceptance into membership. The names, addresses and dates of birth of the team management committee to be submitted by the team when seeking membership annually and any change in committee must be approved by the Club.

All member teams are expected to have at least one representative at each Executive Committee meeting.

Member teams will nominate a representative to attend any League or Association meetings that the team is a member of.

#### **Objectives and Activities**

#### Charitable purposes

To promote public participation in and enjoyment of football for individuals aged between 3 and 21 years irrespective of the participant's sex, race, colour, religion or sporting ability In furtherance of this purpose, but not otherwise, NBFC will: develop the playing and coaching skills of all participating players and officials respectively develop the fitness of all participating players provide a positive and safe environment in which to play developmental football provide a positive and safe environment in which to play 11 a side football provide as and when required, In conjunction with National Development Programmes, Regional Development Programmes and local leagues, access to educational courses covering player protection, player development, drugs awareness, dietary requirements, first aid or any other relevant education for all participating players and officials promote sportsmanship, fair play, respect and self-discipline in players, officials and parents irrespective of gender, race, religion or social status.

#### Charitable Activities

Within the past year NBFC has:

- Continued to expand the number of age groups which means there is representation from 2007 to 2017 in the boys / mixed teams.
- Girls football has been a huge success and have continued to expand with representation at Under 8s, 10s, 12s and 14s.
- Teams are playing 11 a side football in years 2007,2008, 2009, 2010 and 2011
- Teams are playing 7 and 9 a side in years 2012, 2013 and 2014
- Current player numbers are at 420
- Zoom courses to complete further coaching qualifications still are proving very popular.

#### Significant Activities

- -Eleven-a-side North Berwick teams have had great seasons, and for the first time, we have had players from other areas asking to join us.
- -We helped host multiple days of holiday camps for all age groups during the school holidays.
- -We partnered with Box Soccer to deliver professional training to all year groups in addition to our volunteer coaches' sessions.

#### Reserves Policy

It is the policy of the Charity to maintain unrestricted funds, which are free reserves of the Charity, at a level equivalent to three month's expenditure. The Trustees consider that reserves at this level will ensure that, in the event of a significant drop in funding, they will be able to continue the organisation's current activities while consideration is given to ways in which additional funds may be raised.

Based on the accounts for the year ended 31 December 2023, ordinary expenditure for 3 months amounts to £19,981. At 31 December 2023 the charity held unrestricted free reserves of £37,583. The Trustees are therefore satisfied that this policy is being met and the funds in excess of this amount will be invested in the development of the charity.

The charity generated a net surplus of £24,375 for the year ended 31 December 2023 (2022 Deficit: £11,082).

At 31 December 2023 reserves stood at £37,583 (2022: £13,208), with all of these being unrestricted.


