# Introduction


## Intro from [REDACTED], Creative Co-Director

2024/25 was a busy year for Soundplay Projects. Due to the challenging nature of the funding environment 23/23, we had pivoted towards more income generating work. This continued through 24/25, whilst we were also successful in securing funding for several projects. These projects included a Creative Scotland open funded Playspace Development Project.



We worked at 6 ASN schools across Scotland: Mary Russell (Paisley), Mavisbank (Airdrie), Redburn (Cumbernauld), Woodland View (Kirkintilloch), Kingspark (Dundee) and Craighalbert (Cumbernauld). We also worked with large numbers of people at events: Yardworks Festival (SWG3 Glasgow), GlistenFest (LEVEL Centre, Derbyshire), Imagine Children's Festival (National Museum of Scotland, Edinburgh), Music Hall Aberdeen, Paisley Book Festival, Glasgow Children's Hospital, Charlie House (Aberdeen), Platform Family Festival (Easterhouse), Fruitmarket Gallery (Edinburgh), Aberdeen International School, Playful Gardens (Dundee).

During 2024/25 we worked with 3034 people. 310 pupils during 214 school sessions across 6 schools. Plus 2724 people over 61 days with partner venues across the UK

# Our Installations



**'The Soundplay Dome'** is a tour-able musical sensory space for all. Based on high quality multi sensory creative exploration, this immersive touring architecture is easy to set up and incredibly versatile in its delivery.



**'The Ambient Arcade'** is a suite of accessible audio-visual sculptures that playfully engage through communicative and digital exchange based on audio-visual synthesis, touch, and interaction design.



**'The Sub Bass Soft Space'** is a meditative, haptic bean bag sound system. Developed by working with deafblind young people and their families. This vibrational approach to sound and music slows everything down.

# The Playspace

## **PlaySpace - Cadogan Street**

Our space in Glasgow City Centre: a unique venue dedicated to multi-sensory musical play. A space for all ages and abilities, welcoming schools, early years groups, other charities and



## Activities

Our primary tool for engagement is our **immersive music kit**, developed and constantly refined through responsive design. It is a versatile and changing toolkit of Soundplay's sensory based objects, accessible digital instruments, video projection, sound system, percussion and electric guitars.

### **Sensory Saturdays**

Monthly workshops in Dundee, Glasgow & Paisley.

Mornings are free bookable focused workshops.

Afternoon open drop-in for wider public participation.

### **Schools**

Ongoing work with partner ASN schools across Scotland. We work with an average of 4 schools per term.

### **Soundtracks**

We run these artist led workshops monthly with themes around:: technology, sound and participatory practice. Guest presenters have included [REDACTED] (video), [REDACTED] [REDACTED] (voice). They support artist personal and professional development.

### **Special Projects**

Partner activities that are either funded or income generating. They usually align with our objectives and values and open our work to a wider audience.

## Our finances in 2024/25

This was our first full financial year as a registered charity, following an initial nine-month period. With increased maturity and visibility as a charitable organisation, we became eligible for a wider range of funding opportunities, which was reflected in an uplift of over £100,000 in grants awarded – a result we are delighted with.

Alongside this, around one third of our total income was self-generated. This demonstrates a strong and balanced funding model, combining grant support with earned income to underpin our future sustainability. As generated income is unrestricted, it will play a key role in allowing us to build financial reserves and provide a vital cushion for the organisation going forward.

Looking ahead, we anticipate higher capital costs as we progress plans for the development of the Cadogan 2 space and invest in new installations and equipment, ensuring we have the infrastructure needed to support our continued growth.

Youth Music Incubator fund - to support young artists in gaining experience and paid employment in the area of accessible music; CHEF - to deliver accessible music workshops to young people with ASN in Renfrewshire. Aberdeen Creative Funding - as above but for young people in Aberdeen City. Dundee Volunteer and Voluntary Action Fund - to deliver accessible creative workshops for young adults (aged 17-25) in the Dundee area, Glasgow Life Funding to deliver early years and ASN sessions over summer 2024 at our base in Glasgow (the Playspace), Open Fund to develop and create new artwork with young people at the Playspace, Youth Music Initiative Access: to deliver monthly sensory music sessions in Dundee and Paisley, Trefoil Trust: to develop the front room at the Playspace, Moncur Trust: to deliver sessions at DCA Dundee, Youthlink Arts to deliver school workshops at the Playspace.
