Charitable purposes

The organisation's purposes are to advance health of children, and the relief of children in need by reason of age, ill-health, disability, financial hardship or other disadvantage, through the application of creative therapies and the creative arts.

The advancement of health and wellbeing. The relief of those in needs by reason of age, ill-health, disability, financial hardship or other disadvantage.

Summary of the main activities in relation to these objects

Spiral Arts Therapy supports young people in Glasgow, especially in kinship care, through arts therapy. Key activities include:

- **Kinship Care Project**: Improved well-being for 27 young people, with flexible, ongoing support.
- Schools Programme: Partnerships with Glasgow schools and ASN schools, offering embedded mental health services.
- Youth Link Project: 40-week arts program for 32 young people, culminating in a showcase.
- **Sustainability:** Fundraising, lottery participation, and tendering for new contracts. Future goals include expanding services and diversifying income.

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

In 2024, Spiral Creative Arts Therapies increased the delivery of services to children and young people in kinship care. With funding from Corra £92,099 over two years (2023-2025) and matched funding from The Robertson Trust and RS Macdonald (2023-2026) of £15,000 per year.

This year we gained further project funding from Youthlink Scotland £14,793, Essentia (Foundation of Scotland) £3,000. The Trade House Glasgow £3,646 and The Champ Trust £5,000. Separately, the local parent partnership raised funds to allow us to deliver a project for young people transitioning to secondary school, and we received funding to deliver an additional support needs project for young people.

Governance

Spiral Arts Therapy announces the passing of chair Scott McNair. Bernadette Sweeny, a current board member, has assumed his trustee role. May Simpson has also been appointed as a trustee, and we welcome both to their new roles.

The organisation continues to work and develop with young people across Glasgow, thanks to our funders. The Robertson Trust, R S MacDonald, Corra, as well as individual funded projects from various funders.

Project Work / Service Delivery

There are two strands to Spiral: one where we continue to grow our service delivery to the kinship community by building on our experience of working with children and young people in kinship care with our funded kinship care project.

Kinship Care Project

Spiral is currently in its second year of a three-year partnership, with ongoing funding from Corra for an additional two years to support the young people involved in our programs.

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This year, Spiral has been able to work with 27 young people. From our impact report 2023–2024 to 2024–2025, engagement rates have shown significant improvements in areas such as Family Relationships, Self-esteem and Confidence, Reducing Isolation, and Communication. Our data also indicates that our work enhances engagement with education.

The young people we have worked with this year face unique challenges, issues and experiences due to parental substance use. We have observed that they are dealing with increasingly complex family situations compared to previous years, across all age groups. The fact that Spiral's involvement does not have a fixed start or end date, as shown in our impact reports, demonstrates that our approach continues to support them effectively, regardless of the challenges they face.

Schools Programme

Spiral has maintained its involvement in Glasgow schools and was recognised as a preferred supplier for Glasgow City Council's Embedded Mental Health service. This enables schools to collaborate with us using dedicated local government funding.

We also continued our partnership with Glasgow Virtual School, encompassing primary and secondary institutions across Glasgow.

Thanks to funding from previous years, Spiral persists in working with an ASN school, with our music therapist engaging non-verbal young people. This vital work is ongoing today.

Youth Link Project

This year, Spiral Arts Therapies partnered with Youth Link Scotland to offer a youth-led kinship care project in Glasgow. Providing a 40-week multi-arts program allowing young people to choose their artistic activities. Led by a youth steering group, the project offers diverse mediums like visual arts, drama, and storytelling, supported by professional facilitators and artists who mentor and build skills. Weekly sessions are managed by the youth group, which makes key decisions on resources, timelines, and evaluation. The program culminates in a showcase for friends and family, celebrating their achievements and raising awareness of the talents of young people in kinship care. This project aims to create a meaningful arts experience that enhances well-being, develops skills, and fosters lifelong appreciation for the arts.

This project will finish at the end of 2025 but has already increased engagement, enhanced access to the arts, and ongoing support for young people. To date, it has helped an additional 32 young people.

Sustainability

Spiral has submitted a tender to North Lanarkshire Council's Education Services for counselling, support, and advice services and is awaiting the outcome.

Separately, the organisation is now part of Yaldi Lottery, which supports Glasgow's third sector by raising income through a local lottery. The organisation aims to sell 50 tickets and has sold 11 so far, generating a new income of £286 per year towards its £1,300 target.

Meanwhile, we have updated our website and donation pages to enable us to accept direct debits and enhance our fundraising efforts. We are also preparing for our first-ever Kiltwalk later in the year. This diversification has equipped us with the knowledge and understanding to increase donations and support for our local community. We want to thank those who support us in this way.

As the number of projects grew, the organisation required a therapist coordinator to handle referrals and support for therapists. This role was introduced in September and remains active, with a team member working one day a week. Spiral continues to be managed and operated by a small, part-time staff team employed by the charity.

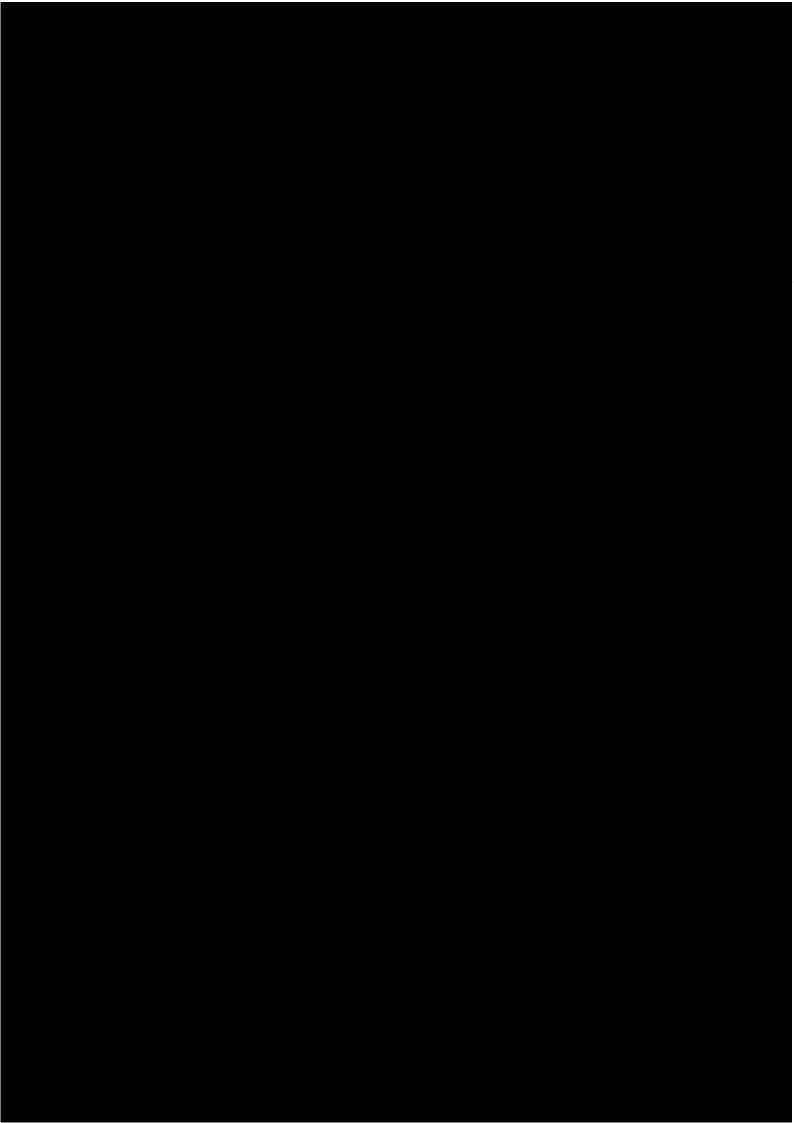
- Continue to deliver quality arts therapeutic services to children in kinship care and their families.
