Objectives and Activities

Orkney Pilgrimage was established in September 2016 to facilitate the development of the St Magnus Way, a 55 mile pilgrimage route through Orkney.

Orkney Pilgrimage's purposes are:

- 1 The advancement of spiritual wellbeing in Orkney through the development of local pilgrimage routes and resources. In particular, to establish and promote the St Magnus Way pilgrimage route in Orkney.
- 2 The advancement of education in local heritage and environment by the development of educational resources associated with pilgrimage.

Achievements and Performance

Orkney Pilgrimage continue to work towards a sustainable future for the St Magnus Way.

We were involved in two local festivals during the year. Firstly, the Orkney Natural Festival, where one of our trustees gave an illustrated talk on The Flora and Fauna of St Magnus Cathedral. Then The Pilgrims Path by local composer Gemma McGregor was performed in St Magnus Cathedral as part of the St Magnus Festival. This suite of six pieces, with accompanying narrative, tells the story of the St Magnus Way.

Work on the Virtual St Magnus Way project nears completion and we look forward to launching it in the spring, making the Way accessible to anyone, anywhere. This project would not have been possible without the drive and enthusiasm of the volunteers who have worked tirelessly to deliver it.

We have had contact with representatives from the Camino Ingles this year and a group looking to create a Shetland Way. Also visiting groups from Norway and Australia. It is heartening to see such a wide interest in pilgrimage.

We are as always, grateful to our dedicated volunteers who monitor and maintain the route, lead guided walk, look after our website and social media sites and many other essential tasks which make up the core of our work. Without them there would be no St Magnus Way.

During 2025 we received a significant donation in memory of Dave Gray and we thank his family for their generosity. We are also grateful to The Friends of St Magnus for financial support to help cover updating our App and web costs associated with the Virtual St Magnus Way. The residue of financial assistance from last year's appeal to Community Councils was also received in this financial year.

Fran Holinrake, Dr David Mazza and Stuart Little stood down from the Board during 2025.

Structure, governance and management

Type of governing document

As a single tier Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation we are governed by a written constitution.

Trustee recruitment and appointment

Our trustees have a diverse range of experience and are recruited to meet the needs of the charity from interested Orkney residents. One third (being the longest in office since last appointment or re appointment) together with those appointed since the previous annual general meeting retire at each annual general meeting but are eligible for re-appointment and are deemed to be re-elected at the next board meeting unless they advise the board that they do not want to be re-elected or a resolution for that person's re-appointment is put to the board and is not carried

Financial review

In our ninth year of operation, we managed to secure a total of £2,500 in grants, of which £200 was support from Community Councils, £2,300 from Friends of St Magnus for IT upgrade and support. A further £2,286 in unrestricted donations and merchandise sales brought our total income for the year to £4,786. During the year we spent a total of £2,645, the majority of which was for path maintenance and development, the accounts for the year are appended to this report and provide further detail on our income and expenditure.

Statement of the charity's policy on reserves

It is the trustees' policy that, within five years of being established, we should maintain sufficient reserves to cover the next six months' operating costs. At 31 December 2025, the total reserves of £7,461.42 were sufficient to cover the next six months' planned expenditure.

Independent Examiner's Report

Independent examiner's report to the trustees of Orkney Pilgrimage

I report to the charity trustees on my examination of the accounts of the Orkney Pilgrimage (the Trust) for the year ended 31 December 2025.

Respective Responsibilities of Trustees and Examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. The charity trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1) (d) of the 2006 Accounts Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under section 44(1) (c) of the Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of Independent Examiner's Statement

My examination is carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the 2006 Accounts Regulations. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeks explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.
