Decommissioning of wind turbine due to age and costs of maintenance. Car park improvement and installation of disabled parking bay. Internal changes to accommodate wheelchair users. Regular warm hub events in partnership with third sector organisations for the winter period to support the local community. Initiation of 100 club to improve fund raising. Future planning into 2026 is the investigation into a replacement renewable energy generation system.
