BOARD REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31st October 2025

We are delighted to present the Board Reports and accounts which represent our second full year of operation.

AKCH is a Member owned and Trustee managed Community Development Trust that serves the people in the Avich and Kilchrenan Community Council area. The Primary Purpose of the charity is to further sustainable community development for the benefit of residents, visitors and the natural environment.

Objectives and Activities

The Organisation's main purpose is consistent with furthering the achievement of sustainable development. The Organisation's Purposes are:

- The advancement of environmental protection or improvement
- The advancement of education
- The advancement of the arts, heritage, culture and science
- The provision of recreational facilities, or the organisation of recreational activities

Volunteers

Community volunteers have been actively engaged in delivering the outcomes of The Community Action Plan, which was completed during the year 01/11/24 to 31/10/25. Both the Board and Community are enthusiastically participating with approximately 100 people involved in the various activities, such as investigating heritage and culture, events related to heritage and culture, and over 112 participants in Community Action Plan process.

Strategic Report

Our Strategic Objectives are to provide services to the Community, to create engaging attractions and viable enterprises, and secure the regeneration and restoration of the natural and man-made environment.

This is primarily achieved by identifying assets within the Community Council area that would be beneficial for purchase, protection and/or restoration by the community.

We then seek funding and other resource for the purchase and renovation/protection of such assets. Such activities are subject to a rigorous business plan to ensure long term financial and environmental sustainability.

Achievements and Performance

Since November 2024, we have built upon the AKCH Board Members' wide range of local skill sets. We have structured ourselves as a main Board, whose duties are primarily to set strategy, ensure its implementation and to fulfil our fiduciary and charitable obligations. Alongside this sit sub-groups covering areas of strategy, funding and individual projects who report to the Main Board for approvals.

Much work has been done on governance during the year with invaluable Board Training from The Development Trust Association of Scotland. Whilst this is sometimes viewed as the "boring bit", it is a vital part of creating a transparent, well-functioning and resilient structure under which AKCH and with it the community we serve can flourish.

Membership has grown during the year from 43 to 81. This represents 32% of the voting population of our community. We continue to actively promote and welcome new membership.

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A very successful community consultation resulted in the production of a Community Action Plan (CAP) for the area. This set out 13 priority projects and several others of importance to the community.

The first acquisitions to be considered were the two historic church buildings at Kilchrenan and Dalavich. Having secured an undertaking from the Church of Scotland that preference be given for a disposal to the Community, AKCH embarked on an assessment of the feasibility and desirability of bringing one or both churches into sustainable Community ownership. Stage 1 funding totalling **£5,910** was obtained from the Scottish Land Fund to carry out that assessment, including building surveys, planning assessments and independent valuations on both churches.

A Business Plan was produced to conserve, refurbish and improve the two buildings to bring them into wider community use (primarily as Cultural Heritage Hubs) whilst preserving the traditional uses of the buildings. We successfully applied for £45,040 Stage 2 funding from the SLF, which was awarded in September. Other activities include:

- Expressions of interest placed in respect of Kilchrenan School Building,
- Creating teams of members and trustees to progress some of the 13 priorities identified in the CAP
- Developing a program of delivery with those teams in areas such as
 - Heritage and culture
 - Loch Access
 - Outdoor recreations
 - Youth group
 - Child's play area

This vital reference work, together with the ongoing work on Community needs through the CAP/LPP, informed a sustainable funding and operational strategy for acquisition, improvement and management of the buildings.

We have also advanced our Business Planning with a defined funding strategy and an assessment of the projects we will take forward for the community ourselves, which will be jointly developed and which we will encourage others to take on.

Financially, the year to the end of October saw a total income of £11,539 and expenditure of £9,005 which generated a net cash surplus of £2,534. This translates into Restricted Funds of £2,279 and Unrestricted Funds of £255.

Future Plans

We have ambitious plans for 25/26 to accelerate the work achieved so far and expect to deliver the following:

- AKCH will work through the process of acquisition which should conclude in December 2025 with the transfer of the two Kirks to AKCH. The appointment of an architect will bring the plans for the buildings to life over the next 3 years. This has been made possible by a very generous donation from a private individual.
- To work with our sister Development Trust, Dalavich Improvement Group, and AKCC to produce a Local Place Plan (LPP) to be adopted by Argyll and Bute Council. Work on the LPP is likely to take most of 2026 and involve further community engagement.
- Confirmed funding from Argyll & Bute will enable us to build a Community Website.
- We will continue to progress the School Building

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- A Loch recreation group is looking at the benefits and challenges of Community loch access in Kilchrenan.
- The Cultural Heritage Group – Awe Heritage History & Archaeology (AHHA) – has a series of talks planned in the coming year.

Overall, a lot has been achieved in this our second year of operation, and the Board would like to express thanks to those who have worked very hard and put in a lot of hours to get us to where we are now. That is a strong position from which to take forward our work for the Community we serve.

This report was accepted by the members at the Annual General Meeting on 14th March 2026.

1. Grants Received from the Scottish Land Fund totalling £5,910 to complete surveys and valuations of the church buildings at both Kilchrenan and Dalavich. The purchase of the two churches from the Church of Scotland was completed after the year end on the 11th December 2025.

2. Grants were received from Drax and Green Power to carry out a Community Action Plan leading to a Local Place Plan This has enabled spending on questionnaires to the community; hall hires for drop in sessions. Printing the housing survey and CAP report.

3. A grant was received of £300 for a local photo competition. The twelve winning photographs have been used to compile an AKCH calendar for 2026.

4. Fundraising - There were two events, a flower festival that raised £782 with expenses of £90 and a strawberry tea that raised £780. Both events raised funds for the CBAR and are restricted.

5. The balance of £2,279 in restricted funds are all restricted for use by the CBAR.

6. There were no Receipts or Payments relating to asset sales during the year.
