Achievements and performance

We have continued every month reviewing the relevant Planning Applications and Karena has also been having training sessions with Esmond.

In August we had been working with Alistair Millar, Roads, about a number of issues round and about. He also told us there was a more simplified new system for recording road defect/issues. It's called 'Fix my Street'. It appears to be a more simplified way of logging defects/faults within the road (incl footways, verges etc) and allows the customer to accurately pinpoint the location of the issue via a mapping tool.

In October, a couple of us attended the Disability Equality Scotland AGM in the P&J Live Centre in Aberdeen. Lots of comments and information was passed onwards regarding our problems with the Stagecoach buses.

In November we had a visit from two Disability Equality Scotland reps ~ Emma and Sarah (hybrid). They stayed for most of the meeting and some good things came out of their visit.

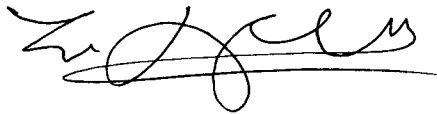

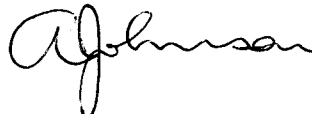
