Type of governing document	The charity is governed by its constitution.
Trustee recruitment and appointment	Potential trustee appointments are identified and nominated by existing trustees from people who are already involved in the charity and understand and support the vision of the charity. The appointment of the trustee is put to a simple majority vote if no consensus is reached.

Objectives and activities

Charitable purposes	The charity is driven by the primary purpose of preventing or relieving poverty; improving (physical and mental) wellbeing through the provision of recreational facilities and organization of recreational activities for the persons for whom the interventions are intended; and the relief of those in need by reason of age, ill-health, disability, financial hardship or any other disadvantage.
Summary of the main activities in relation to these objects	1. Daily drop-in session every weekday for engagement and mutual support over hot meals. 2. Provision of a safe and reflective space for service users to discuss their struggles (confidential meetings) and to receive necessary socioeconomic support essential for wellbeing. 3. Provision of communication and information management facilities for digital inclusiveness and wellbeing necessities (like making medical appointments, among other things). 4. Facilitating wellbeing and recovery-oriented recreational activities, featuring regular indoor games and quarterly outdoor activities. 5. Support with skills acquisition, improvement and referrals where and when necessary.

APPENDIX 1

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

Supported over 70 different people at different times through the daily drop-in sessions, with meals served every week day and food parcels given intermittently.

Supported about 30 asylum seekers and refugees with hospitality and language classes to ease their integration into the community.

Regular street outreach to provide support to homeless folks and persons with alcohol/substance misuse issues.

Promotion of health and wellbeing among service users with indoor recreational activities and special outings.

Setting up a Community Information Point for the provision of free and confidential access to health information and signposting to local services.
