Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of The Weir Family Foundation

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2026 which are set out on the attached pages.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. The charity trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1) (a) to (c) of the Accounts Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under Section 44(1) (c) of the Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of Independent examiner's statement

My examination is carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts and seeks explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.

Independent examiner's statement

In the course of my examination, no matter has come to my attention.

Report of the trustees for year ended 31 March 2026

Objectives, activities and achievements

The Charity's principal purposes are:

- The prevention or relief of poverty
- The advancement of education
- The advancement of health
- The advancement of public participation in sport
- The relief of those in need by reason of age, ill health, disability, financial hardship or other disadvantage
- The advancement of animal welfare

The area within which the organisation shall operate is Scotland and the surrounding areas.

During the year, the Charity's activities principally involved accumulating funds through donations received to support its future charitable objectives. The Charity made one grant during the year to Grange Academy, Kilmarnock, to assist with the establishment of a girls' football academy. The Trustees continued to consider how the Charity's resources can best be deployed in future years to further its charitable purposes and maximise public benefit.

Financial review

In the year ended 31 March 2026 the Charity made a surplus of £51,777 (2025: deficit of £840). The surplus primarily reflects donations received during the year which have been retained to support the Charity's planned charitable activities and grant-making in future periods. Subsequent to the year end, the Charity made a further grant of £12,000 to Robert Burns Academy, Cumnock, to support the establishment of a girls' football academy. The Trustees are satisfied that the Charity remains in a strong financial position to further its charitable purposes.

Reserves Policy

The Charity's policy is to retain sufficient reserves to allow the Trustees flexibility in identifying and supporting charitable projects which further the Charity's purposes. The Trustees will keep the level of reserves under regular review, taking account of future funding commitments and anticipated charitable activities.

Structure, governance and management

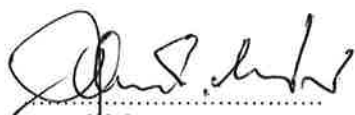
The Weir Family Foundation is a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (SCIO) governed by its constitution. Given the nature and scale of the Charity's activities, the Trustees have elected to prepare Receipts and Payments accounts for the year ended 31 March 2026. The Trustees are responsible for administering the affairs of the Charity, including the maintenance of its finances.

Trustees are appointed by the Board in accordance with the Charity's constitution. Charity Trusteeship is open to individuals aged 16 and over and to corporate bodies that support the Charity's purposes.
