Thornton Rose RDA has continued to deliver equine-assisted activities and therapeutic riding sessions to individuals with physical, learning, and mental health support needs throughout the year. As the only RDA group in Midlothian, the charity plays a vital role in supporting inclusion, wellbeing, and personal development through structured equine interactions.

#### Service Delivery and Impact

- Regular sessions were delivered twice weekly, supporting both returning and new participants.
- Activities included mounted and unmounted sessions, tailored to meet individual needs.
- Feedback from participants and families has helped shape ongoing improvements in communication and session planning.
- Weather-related challenges have been managed to ensure continuity and safety, although climate impacts remain a concern.
- Mental health and wellbeing sessions were delivered over the summer, supported by external funding.

#### Volunteer Involvement

- The charity remains entirely volunteer-run. Volunteers contribute across all areas including session support, horse care, fundraising, and administration.
- Recruitment of new volunteers has continued, with young people and adults involved.
- Training opportunities have been accessed to support development in areas such as safeguarding, equine care, and specialist support roles.
- Volunteer recognition initiatives were introduced to acknowledge ongoing contributions.
