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Achievements and performance

Store Vouchers & Food

We helped people struggling with the cost-of-living crisis by providing store vouchers and food parcels. This support reached low-income families, refugees, undocumented migrants, homeless individuals, and elderly people from ethnic minority backgrounds.

Digital Inclusion

We ran digital skills sessions aimed at low-income and unemployed individuals from BAME communities, as well as refugees. These sessions helped participants grow more confident using technology, opening doors to better job prospects, education, and everyday online services.

Support Services

We offered a welfare advice service for refugees, asylum seekers, and migrants on low incomes. This covered guidance on social security entitlements, managing debt, boosting household income, housing issues, finding employment, and connecting people with other relevant support services.
