3 cataract surgeries were carried out to eligible local patients. All treatments were provided through the Ayrshire Eye Foundation 'gift of sight' programme with local optometry practices.

'Gift of Sight' programme was originally launched with local optometry practices in January 2022. Optometrists were asked to nominate patients awaiting treatment on NHS who could not afford to seek treatment privately but would benefit greatly from their treatment being carried out quickly. Social, financial and health criteria were to be considered to ensure that the most vulnerable and deserving patients could benefit from the programme.

This programme has run several times with the most current programme open for nominations between 17th September and 10th November 2025.

Trustees met on 6th January 2026 to discuss nominations received from optometry practices through the 'gift of sight' programme described above. Each case was discussed to ensure each patient met the criteria set out and if treatment was appropriate. 2 patients were identified – 1 requiring unilateral cataract surgery and 1 requiring a bilateral cataract surgery. Each identified patient received their treatment at Ayrshire Eye Clinic at no cost to them. Ayrshire Eye Clinic facility costs, staff costs, required consumables and instruments were donated to the programme.
