## APPENDIX 1

### Achievements and performance

#### Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

1. Provision of pastoral counselling to many individuals and families facing personal challenges
2. Meetings of the Charity became hybrid; some meetings continue online and some (e.g. weekly Sunday service and quarterly 10-hour prayers meeting) at the property of the Charity.
3. With the weekly youth meeting of average attendance of 22, structured Bible study tools were established with increased youth-led initiatives and active engagement. In addition, the youth had access to mentorship and support
4. Evening Oblation enhanced children's ability to pray using scripture, lead prayers and engage in spiritual activities.
5. Some of the services of the Charity were livestreamed online for wider outreach and audience.
6. The weekly Power and Prophetic Service (with an average of 70 attendance) fostered spiritual breakthroughs and testimonies of participants.
7. The weekly Community Bible Study (with an average of 30 attendance) created an interactive platform for discussions on Christian faith and learnings.
8. Held four quarterly 10-hour prayer meetings
