Glasgow Chamber Choir is an unincorporated association governed by its constitution.

Trustee recruitment and appointment

Trustees (committee members) are elected by the members of the Choir at the Annual General Meeting, held annually in September.

Trustees are not required to retire by rotation.

Objectives and activities

Charitable purposes

The objectives of Glasgow Chamber Choir are to advance the education of the public in the art of choral chamber music by the presentation of public performances and other related activities. In furtherance thereof, the Choir will seek to:

- (i) Provide musical entertainment for the benefit of the inhabitants of the City of Glasgow and its surrounding area; and elsewhere;
- (ii) Contribute to the wider understanding and knowledge of music within the community;
- (iii) Provide the means by which members of the community may participate in providing such entertainment and developing their musical talents.

Summary of the main activities in relation to these objects

The choir performed a number of concerts in Glasgow and Edinburgh over the course of the year.

The choir also celebrated their 30th Anniversary with a reunion of members from across the years. The choir also had the opportunity to take part in a BBC SSO concert and continued to make its library of choral music available to other choirs around the UK.

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Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

Over the 24/25 Financial period, the choir gave performances as follows:

October - the choir performed together with the BBC SSO, a programme of Scottish music including MacMillan.

November - the choir celebrated its 30th anniversary with a reunion including previous members singing a selection of musical favourites from across the years. The choir put on a concert centred on a piece by Frank Martin. This was hosted by Helensburgh Parish Church.

December - A Christmas concert in aid of the Beatson Cancer Charity at Bearsden Parish Church was held to close off the calendar year.

February - The choir performed as part of the Celtic Connections festival in the Kelvingrove Art Gallery and Museum.

March - the choir performed a concert of Part, Poulence and Purcell. This was held at St Margaret's Episcopal Church in Newlands.

June - the choir performed a concert centred around Stanford's Bluebird with other music by Bingham, Clarke, Beamish, Palestrina and Weir. The choir performed this program twice in Glasgow at Kelvinside Hillhead Parish Church and in Crichton Collegiate Church in Midlothian
