Objectives and activities

Charitable purposes

Our charity exists primarily for the advancement of religion. As a local Presbyterian church based in Edinburgh, we aim to share the Christian faith and deliver God's word to the community. We provide worship services in Korean, open to anyone interested in worshipping in that language and cultural environment. We also support the advancement of education and community development by helping international students and others learn about Korean language and culture, and by providing a supportive environment for personal and spiritual growth. Additionally, we contribute to the wellbeing of the local community by promoting mental and emotional support through fellowship, guidance, and pastoral care.

Summary of the main activities in relation to these objects

We hold weekly Sunday worship services in Korean to support the advancement of religion and provide a space for spiritual growth. After each service, we have fellowship meetings to build community and offer pastoral care. We regularly study the Bible and religious texts to deepen understanding of Christian teachings and support the advancement of education in faith matters.

Each year, we organise a church retreat to give members a chance to reflect, reconnect with God, and grow spiritually away from daily distractions. Throughout the year, we also hold social and cultural events to encourage fellowship and support emotional wellbeing.

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

During the financial period, we continued to hold regular Sunday worship services and fellowship meetings, providing spiritual support and community for our members.

We successfully organised our annual church retreat, which offered attendees meaningful time for reflection, prayer, and deeper connection with God's word in a peaceful environment.

We held several fellowship events throughout the year to promote community bonding and support members' mental and emotional wellbeing, especially those living far from their families. These gatherings were well-attended and positively received.

We also strengthened our support for Korean Christian students in Scotland by helping facilitate worship services and retreats, providing them with spiritual guidance and a sense of belonging. This was particularly valuable for new students adjusting to life in the UK.

Throughout the year, we maintained our commitment to creating a welcoming, culturally familiar environment where Korean speakers—and those interested in Korean language and culture—could explore and practice their faith.

Financial review

Brief statement of the charity's policy on reserves

The charity aims to maintain a modest level of reserves to ensure it can meet its ongoing commitments and manage unforeseen expenses. We seek to hold reserves equivalent to approximately 3 to 6 months of regular operating costs, such as venue rental, event expenses, and essential materials for worship and fellowship. This policy ensures the financial stability of the church and supports the continuity of its core activities in the event of a short-term drop in income.

The charity did not incur a deficit during the financial period. Income was sufficient to meet all regular expenses, and a small surplus was carried forward.
