In terms of numbers involved we have created repeated activity for over 600 children and adults over the year from April 2024 to March 2025. This doesn't happen without the hard work and effort from all involved in the Trust board and Trust partners for their support.

2024-2025

We are working with our Development Officer to recruit additional coaching staff to run additional activities with view to running regular activities within local schools and build on that programmes through further Forfar cluster schools.

Successful Easter Holiday Camps, children ages 5-12 attended our football camps and were well received by the children and parents. The McDonalds Fun Football sessions for kids age 5 were a success and enjoyed by many.

We continue our Women's and Men's Walking football programme, regular exercise for those coming along to the sessions on Mondays and Wednesdays and looking to continuing growth at these sessions throughout the year.

Our other regular activities continue to be popular and growing over time. Men's Recreational football, Little Loon, Just Play, Development sessions to name a few.

Our successful annual Fun Day was another success where we plan and run the day along with our community partner clubs Forfar Athletic Community FC and Forfar Farmington FC.

We continue to support as many SPFL initiative as we can and really enjoy the Festive Friends initiative where we run with our festive Hampers and social activity.

Sustainability of the existing Trust Board is very important, and recognising the individual skill sets, and community links, which may identify additional potential Board members.
