Biggar Music Club (aka “Biggar Music”) is a small local charity which brings professional musicians to the community to present live chamber music. This enables members of the community to attend such performances without the need to travel to Edinburgh or Glasgow. Many audience members are elderly. Biggar Music also sponsors workshops in the local Primary and High Schools. Biggar Music presented nine concerts during the reporting period, bringing a wide range of live music to Biggar. Programmes included string quartets, trios, solo pianist, and a brass quintet, and spanned a range of genres from classical to Baroque, to klezmer.

The Friends of Biggar Music Club Trust donated £2000 in the financial year 2025-26, to compensate for shortfall in ticket sales, and sustain the high quality of musician to which Biggar Music has always aspired.

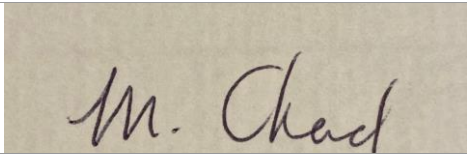
