Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

At the end of 2025, 17 children remain in the care of the home. As previously reported, the home is no longer getting any children from the Children's Department in line with their future intentions to close all the privately run homes in Kenya.

Four of those children sat their final secondary school exams (KCSE) in November 2025 and will be supported with vocational training in line with their interests and one possibly can go to university.

The three young people who completed their vocational training courses in 2025 have gained employment (Hospitality and Catering, Automotive Engineer, and Customer Service), remain at the home meantime. They are able to stay until financially able to support themselves. They will be supported with living independently for three months.

We have had a reduction in the number of sponsors as the young people leave education and gain employment, their sponsors withdraw their support. We do still have supporters who make both regular and ad hoc with are used for general running costs of the home.
