Type of governing document

Constitution

Trustee recruitment and appointment

Trustees appointed by majority vote at AGM. All appointments renewed annually.

Objectives and activities

Charitable purposes

The object of the Society is to educate the public in the dramatic and operatic arts, to further the development of public appreciation and taste in the said arts, to assist and further such charitable institutions and charitable purposes as the Committee shall from time to time determine. In furtherance of this object but not otherwise the Society through its management committee shall have the following powers:

- (a) To promote plays. Drama, comedies, operas, operettas and other dramatic and operatic works of educational value.
- (b) To purchase, acquire and obtain interests in the copyright of or the right to perform or show any such dramatic or operatic work.
- (c) To purchase or otherwise acquire plant, machinery, furniture, fixtures, fittings, scenery and all other necessary effects.
- (d) To raise funds and invite and receive contributions from any person or persons whatsoever by way of subscription, donation and otherwise provided that the Society shall not undertake any permanent trading activities in raising funds.
- (e) To do all such things as shall further the objects of the Society.

Summary of the main activities in relation to these objects

- 1) Spring concerts comprising a compilation of songs of many genres to raise funds to support further activities and make charitable donations to chosen charity
- 2) Annual run of stage shows in late September comprising a miscellany of songs performed with costume and dance features to raise funds for charitable donations
- 3) Christmas concerts including a miscellany of traditional and festive music.
- 4) Involvement with significant sponsored sporting events undertaken by individual members of the company to channel further funds towards chosen charity donations.

Achievements and performance

Brief statement of the charity's policy on reserves

The company aims to raise as much as possible for the chosen charity support. For a number of years this has been MacMillan Cancer Support.

Reserve funds are only maintained to allow payment of production and other "up front" costs for subsequent fundraising events.

In addition, a small revenue reserve is maintained by the company for General Company business.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

While raising money through our standard methods of putting on musical productions, many additional fundraising events were taken on by members to boost the fund raised even further.

Due to this, Showcase was able to make a donation of £16,000 to Macmillan Cancer Support. (fund raised by additional events were through JustGiving pages and therefore the funds went directly to Macmillan without passing through the Showcase accounts)
