TRUSTEES REPORT AND PROFILE

The Trust was constituted by formal Deed of Trust by Sydney Littler (deceased) in memory of his late wife, Alice. The formal Deed was recorded in the Registers of Scotland on 8 December 1978. Charitable status for tax purposes was granted by the Inland Revenue on 1 May 1981 under reference ED 43/79/GWM. Inland Revenue Claims (Scotland) advised SC Number SC010063 in their letter dated 26 October 1992.

The principal purpose of the Trust is to financially support voluntary or charitable organisations and groups but restricted to those within the 'Community of Aberlour and District'. The Trust can from time to time support projects that benefit the environment or people of 'Aberlour and the immediate surrounding area'.

The original Trustees were nominated by the late Sydney Littler, with no prescriptive period being placed on their appointment.

Asset Holding

The Trust has fishing Rights extending to approximately $\frac{3}{4}$ mile of the Spey riverbank alongside the village of Aberlour. The fishings are let out to Aberlour Angling Club on a 25 year lease, effective from 1 January 2010. Rent reviews are carried out every three years, with the last review being in January 2025 setting the rent at £4,200 pa.

The Trust owns several paintings by a local artist, which have local interest but limited monetary value.

The objective of the Trustees is to maintain a minimum capital sum of £15,000 with any sums in excess being available for distribution.

Distribution of Funds

A grant of £700 was paid to the Aberlour Community Association Garden Volunteers towards the cost of planting and maintaining the floral displays in the village.

A grant of £4,200 was paid to Aberlour Tennis Club to help it purchase equipment to enhance its appeal and hopefully attract new members.

Administrative Expenses

Insurance costs rose by £34 to £148.91 for the year.

There were no paid employees during the year to 31 December 2025.
