

The trustees present their annual report and financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2024, along with the independent examiner's report.

West Dunbartonshire Gymnastics Club is a charity registered with the Office of the Scottish Charity Regulator (OSCR), charity number SC050947.

Trustees

The Trustees who served during the year and were in office at the year-end of 31 December 2024 were;



Structure, Governance and Management

The Charity is governed by its constitution. Membership is open to parents and guardians living in West Dunbartonshire and surrounding areas. The management of the Charity is vested in the management committee, members of which are elected by the membership at the annual general meeting.

Objectives and Activities

The objectives of the charity are;

- To provide high quality affordable gymnastics classes for families living in West Dunbartonshire and surrounding areas.
- The advancement of public participation in sport.
- The provision of recreational facilities, or the organisation of recreational activities, with the object of improving the conditions of life for the persons for whom the facilities or activities are primarily intended.

Achievements and Performance

The club provided gymnastics classes to over 120 members and continued to provide training for our coaches and young volunteers including that required to meet Scottish and British Gymnastics requirements.

A very successful year for the club. The club continued to deliver a varied programme of recreational and competitive sessions face to face to our members. We also fully resumed the competition calendar and brought medals and trophies back and shared our success with our members and wider community.

We had 12 4-piece gymnasts who competed this year across 2 and 4-piece apparatus. Four gymnasts passed grades at development, including one gymnast becoming 2010-2008 age group champion. One gymnast passed preparation 2 and five gymnasts passed preparation 1. We also had 21 2-piece gymnasts who competed in floor and vault, bringing back some medals and judges awards. For some of the gymnasts it was their first time competing. Two of our long-term competitive gymnasts made transition to UKCC Level 1 coaches this year too.

The appointment of 2 Trustees was dealt with via a recruitment campaign.

Statement of Risk

The management committee has assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, in particular those related to the operations and finances of the charity and are satisfied that the systems are in place to mitigate the exposure to major risks.

Brucehill Activity Centre

As of November 2024, we signed a lease with West Dunbartonshire Council to take over the running of our training facility (Brucehill Activity Centre). Although we were reluctant to do this the Council gave us no option as the alternative would have been for the venue to close resulting in nowhere to train and no club. As a goodwill gesture the Council have given us the first 2 years rent free but we now have to cover all of the running costs which include heat and light, water rates, caretaker/cleaner, alarm, statutory safety checks and any repairs and maintenance. We estimate that annual incremental costs will be somewhere in the region of £15-£20k. In addition, from year 3, we will be charged an annual lease fee of £14k, going up to £17k the year after.

While we do currently have healthy reserves (see below) these have been earmarked for new/replacement equipment and will quickly be used up by the increase in operating costs. In order to fund the deficit, we will be re-visiting our current fee rates and setting substantial fundraising targets each year. We are also actively looking for grant funding opportunities. Due to the cost-ofliving crisis, we are aware that members cannot afford for their fees to keep rising so we will do all we can to keep any increase to a minimum. We also want to be able to keep all of our programs running - young volunteer, disability and scholarship. We have been actively searching for alternative training venues as another potential option however there is nothing on the market that comes close to what we need and so the Trustees and Committee are committed to making this work.

Financial Review

For the period to 31 December 2024 a total of £81,089 was raised, the majority of which was from fee income and annual membership income. A number of fundraising activities were carried out which raised £4,847. No grant funding was received in the period. Total payments amounted to £78,077 resulting in a surplus of £3,012.

As at 31 December 2024 the charity held total reserves of £78,631. Of these reserves £60,611 has been allocated to a designated fund for new/replacement equipment and any necessary building repairs and maintenance that may arise. The equipment includes replacement of current sprung floor, competition vault, set of A bars, springboard, air track and crash mats.

In the view of the management committee, the charity has sufficient unrestricted reserves to continue to operate for the foreseeable future.

INDEPENDENT EXAMINERS REPORT

I report on the accounts of West Dunbartonshire Gymnastics Club (SC050947) for the year ending 31 December 2024 which are set out on pages 7-10.

Respective responsibilities of the Trustees and Examiner

The charity's Trustees are responsible for the preparation of accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 as amended in 2010. The charity Trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1) (d) of the Accounts Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under section 44(1) (c) of the Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of Independent Examiner's Statement

My examination is carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented in those records. It also includes the consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeks explanations from the Trustees concerning such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

1. Fees and Subscriptions

An amount of £66,851 was raised during the 12-month period from class fees and annual membership fees. This is down on previous year as, due to the cost of living crisis, some gymnasts are taking fewer classes. Corresponding coaching costs are down (note 7).

2. Competition Fees Income and Expenses

The Club was able to attend a number of competitions this year. Competition fee Income from gymnasts amounted to £3,293 with corresponding expenses of £4,517. Expenditure is higher than income as we are charged a non-judging fee as we don't supply any judges. We will start to recover this fee during 2025 by including a judging levy on top of the competition fee.

3. Grants Receivable

No grants were received during the period.

4. Fundraising Activities

The Club raised £4,847 from fundraising activities including an annual awards night, a club competition, a bag pack and birthday parties with associated expenses of £724 (excluding coaches time). This is the second year of hosting birthday parties which have been very successful and contributed £1,270.

5. Bank Interest

At the end of 2023 we created a designated fund and moved this income into an interest-bearing bank account with Virgin Money. We received £610 in interest during the year.

6. Other Income

This income relates to £2,000 for an asset sale (pommel horse) and £2,240 for a Club trip for 36 gymnasts to the Inverciyde sports centre. The related costs of the trip are shown in note 11 below.

7. Coaches

A total of £36,787 was spent on coaching expenses during the period. The Club currently has 11 paid coaches and 8 volunteers.

Venue Expenses

These include rent from WD Leisure up until we took over the lease plus costs now associated with running the venue ourselves (cleaning wages etc).

Scottish/British Gymnastics

Costs of £881 relate to payments to Scottish and British Gymnastics for membership, PVG's, safeguarding, coaches' insurance and course fees for coaches.

10. Insurance

The annual equipment insurance costs for the club were paid in March 2024.

11. Other Expenses

The Building Survey was undertaken on the Brucehill Activity Centre prior to us signing the lease as we wanted to fully understand the state of the building and future potential repairs and maintenance.

The Mortgage Application was carried out as a building came up for sale which could have been a potential alternative training venue. While we weren't successful in securing the building the application process was worthwhile to establish the amount of money we could raise.

12. Bank and Cash In Hand

The closing balance as at 31 December 2024 is £78,631 of which £60,611 has been allocated by the Committee to a designated fund for equipment (new and replacement) and also for any repairs and maintenance costs which may arise as a result of taking on the lease of the facility.

13. Assets

While the club do not have a specific fixed asset register, they do own a large amount of gymnastics equipment. This equipment has been insured for a value of £101,700.
