Structure, Governance and Management

Governing Document

The Church is administered as "Quoad Omnia" i.e. the Kirk Session being responsible for all matters within the church.

Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees

Members of the Kirk Session are the charity trustees. There is no Congregational Board. The Kirk Session members are the elders of the church and are chosen from those members of the church who are considered to have the appropriate gifts and skills. The minister, who is a member of the Kirk Session, is elected by the congregation and inducted by Presbytery.

Organisational Structure

The Kirk Session is chaired by the minister or by the interim moderator during a period of vacancy and meets at least ten times year. Certain responsibilities are delegated to the Finance Committee, Property Committee or Worship Committee as appropriate. The Kirk Session is responsible for all property and financial matters within the local church and for spiritual oversight of the congregation and parish.

Objectives and Activities

The Church of Scotland is Trinitarian in doctrine, Reformed in tradition and Presbyterian in polity. It exists to glorify God and to work for the advancement of Christ's Kingdom throughout the world. As a national Church, it acknowledges a distinctive call and duty to bring the ordinances of religion to the people in every parish of Scotland through a territorial ministry. It co-operates with other Churches in various ecumenical bodies in Scotland and beyond.

There has been a Cambusnethan Parish Church at least since the twelfth century. As the local parish Church of Scotland, we are committed to sharing the love and truth of God in Jesus Christ through prayer and praise, Bible teaching, learning together and in our active engagement with people of all ages in our parish and local community. The church supports a number of church organisations although the COVID 19 pandemic has seen a number of these close or enter into a period of stasis. The church organisations include a Choir, Girls' Brigade and Boys' Brigade companies, and Taekwondo, and a Lunch Club. A number of social activities usually take place throughout the year, in addition to fundraising activities for Christian Aid etc.

Achievements and Performance

Whilst attendance at Sunday morning services has stabilised the numbers have not reached pre-pandemic levels of attendance. A similar picture is reflected in the attendance at a number of church organisations with the Choir and Lunch Club continuing to have a healthy membership at their weekly meetings throughout the year, though membership of the Girl's Brigade and Boys' Brigade has declined. We have also successfully managed to launch a new Wednesday activity afternoon which attracts a number of members to enjoy fun and fellowship for a couple of hours each Wednesday.

We continue with our local outreach in a number of care homes by holding regular monthly informal services at Morningside and Kirknowe Care homes. We also continue to subsidise transport for members of our congregation who previously attended our Mission Church at Morningside prior to its closure to ensure that they continue to be part of the church family. We again this year held our annual acts of Remembrance with wreath laying services being held at Morningside War Memorial as well as at the War Memorial within the church grounds.

Operation of the church continues to require careful attention and once again we fulfilled our Giving to grow contributions despite reducing income and the uncertainty created by the Presbytery Mission Planning process. The ongoing mission planning process has once again contributed to an increased workload of the Kirk Session and Office bearers.

The church remains without a Minister since the retiral of previous minister in 2017, and we continued under the year leadership of the who is both our Interim moderator and Locum.

Financial Review

The main source of congregational income is weekly freewill offerings, givings by standing orders, lump sum givings and Gift Aid refunds. The income for the current year has decreased by 1.07% mainly due to monies transferred from funds at Edinburgh, which were lower than the transferred funds last year, stripping out the transfer of funds the income has increased by 7.7% partly due to the increase of donations, bank rates and fund raising activities. The Congregational givings has decreased by 2.4%. Tax recovered from Gift Aid has increased by 28.6%. The expenditure has decreased by 18.9% mainly due to 3 years of organist fees being paid in 2022. Heat and Light costs have increased by 96.2% reflecting the electricity bill that not been received for 3 years and the estimated gas bill for the manse payed in December. The estimated gas bill for the manse of £4,000 has been queried and correct readings will be submitted and a refund of overpayment will been requested.

The main expenditure incurred by the Church is the Giving to Grow Contributions paid to The Church of Scotland by standing order over 10 months (February–November) each financial year. The value for 2023 is £21,670.

Reserves Policy

It is the Trustees' policy to hold in reserve as much as possible in the Fabric Fund, given the age of the Church building, which is a listed building, with particular regard to the possible costs of repairs to the church, such as roof repairs, refurbishment, notwithstanding that regular checks are made and maintenance works are regularly carried out to ensure its condition is maintained. The same policy also applies to the manse.

At the year end the Church held unrestricted cash funds of £22,168 (excluding designated Organisations Accounts) of which £7,862 is held in the Fabric Fund and the balance (£14,306) is held in the remaining Unrestricted Funds which represents less than 3 months expenditure.

Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities

The members of the Kirk Session must prepare financial statements which give sufficient detail to enable an appreciation of the transactions of the Church during the financial year. The members of the Kirk Session are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which, on request, must reflect the financial position of the Church at that time. This must be done to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 and the Regulations Anent Congregational Finance approved by the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland in 2007. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Church and must take reasonable steps for the prevention and/or detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Report of the Independent Examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006.

Basis of independent examiner's statement

My examination is carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeks explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.
